The mission of the Friends' Foundation is to raise money to support Jeffery Hale - Saint Brigid's in its quest to provide quality health and social services to all its residents and clients.

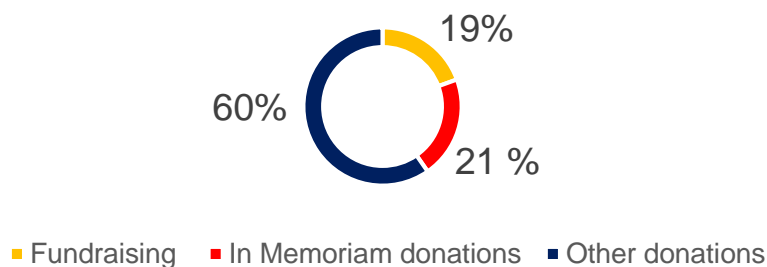
This report presents the results of the Friends' Foundation fundraising activities and projects financed for the year 2018.

"In September of 2018, Jeffery Hale-Saint Brigid's Users' Committee was granted funds from the Jeffery Hale Friends' Foundation to purchase thirty Handybars. The Handybars are devices that are designed to help physically challenged people get into a car.
